## The Trentham Hotel



The Trentham Hotel was built by The Duke of Sutherland and opened in 1867. It was located on the site of the Roebuck Inn, which had burnt down in 1865. When the old Trentham Inn on the Stone Road closed in 1867, the Trentham New Inn became the only licensed premises on the estate.

Later renamed the Trentham Hotel, it was situated close to Trentham station and provided accommodation for visitors who did not merit board at Trentham Hall. It was extended with a billiard room in 1903.

Kelly's directory entry 1912: The Trentham Hotel is well fitted and appointed and has spacious dining rooms, suitable for clubs and parties; attached are large gardens with spacious lawns and a bowling green and good loose boxes and stabling for hunters etc. Frank E. H. Pember is listed as the manager.

The telephone number is Trentham 6.

The hotel was let in 1915 to Stone based brewery John Joule & Son Ltd and they bought it for £11,000 at auction in 1919.

After its sale by the Trentham Estate a football ground was laid out to the south, off Oaktree Road.

Later this became the ground of Trentham Rugby Football Club, until the land was sold by Bass in 2000 for redevelopment.

Leading from Main Hall on Ground Floor to Chamber Floor, is handsome staircase built in

Leading from passage way on Ground Floor is a second Staircase terminating on Landing to which open 4 Bedrooms, Housemaid's Pantry and W.C.

In the Basement of Building is Heating Furnace, the function of which is to provide hot water for bath and radiators.
